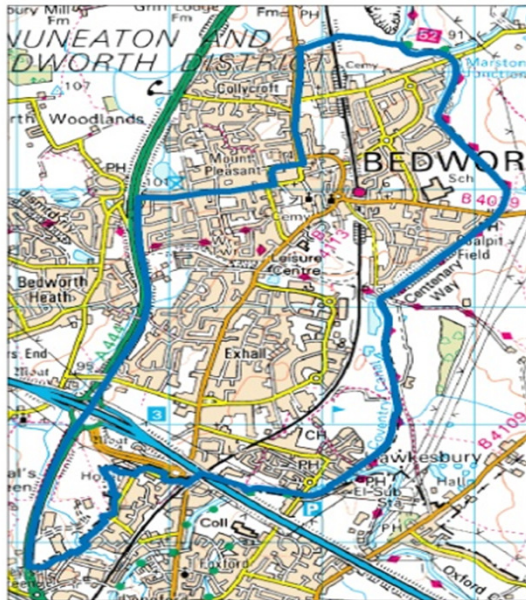


## Bede & Poplar



The locality of Bede & Poplar comprises the wards of Bede, Poplar and the eastern part of Exhall. It also includes the County Council Electoral Divisions of Bede and Poplar. This compact urban area is approximately 2 square miles in size. Bedworth town centre is located in the northern half of this locality, with the residential and industrial mix of the Exhall area in the south. In addition to its populated area, the locality incorporates a small parcel of land to the south of the M6, bordering the Longford area of Coventry.

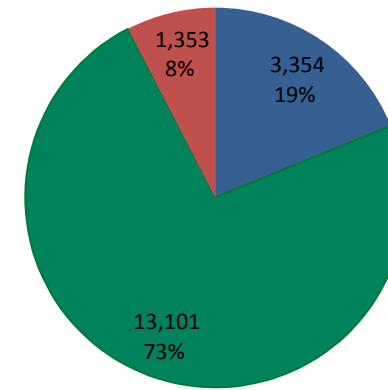

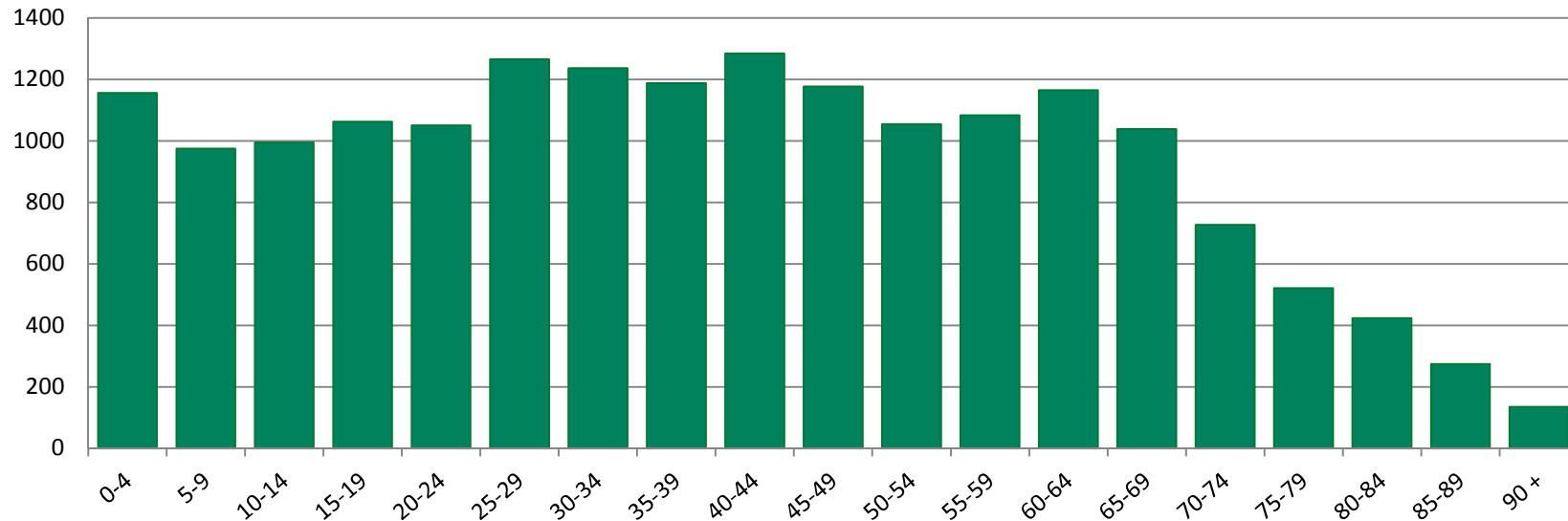

## Population By Five Year Age Groups

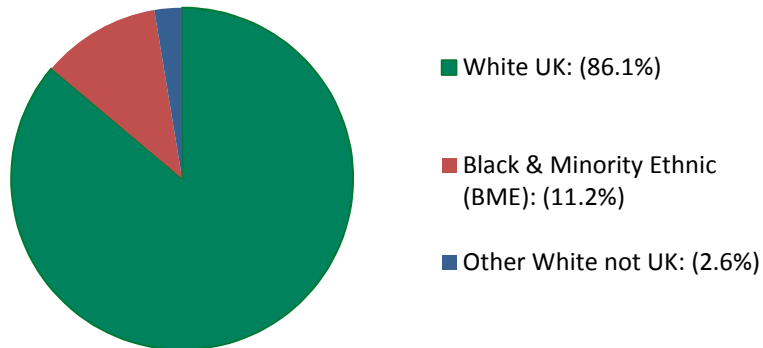

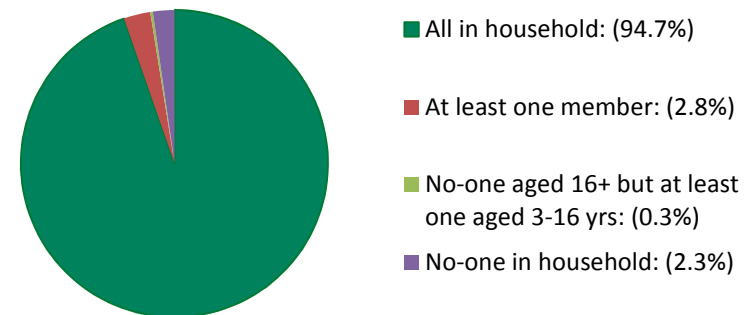

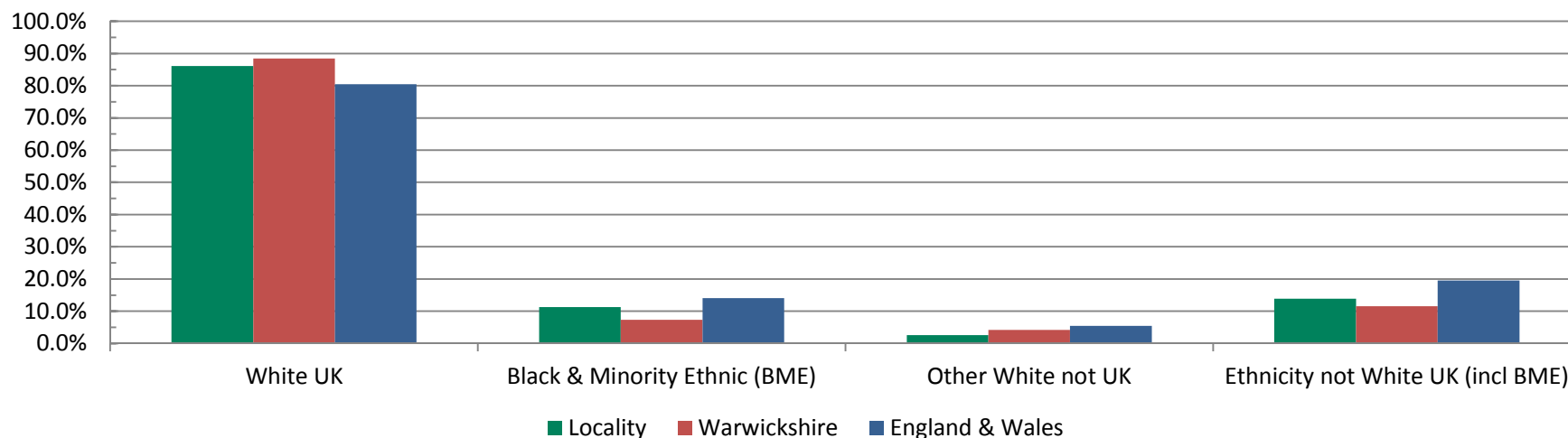
### Composition of Locality Population

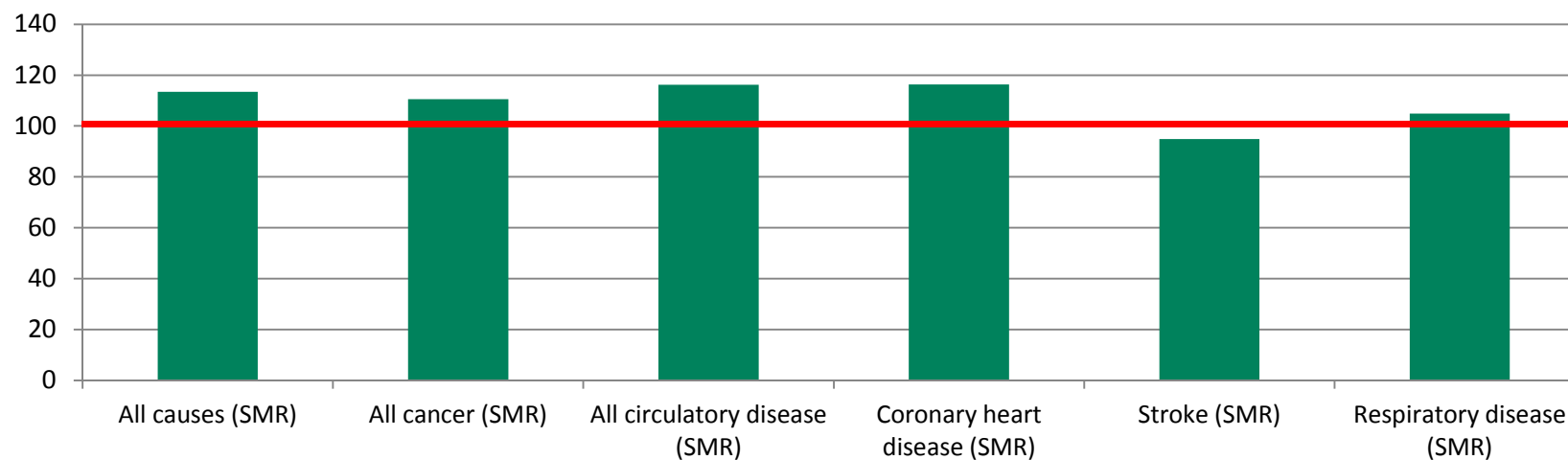

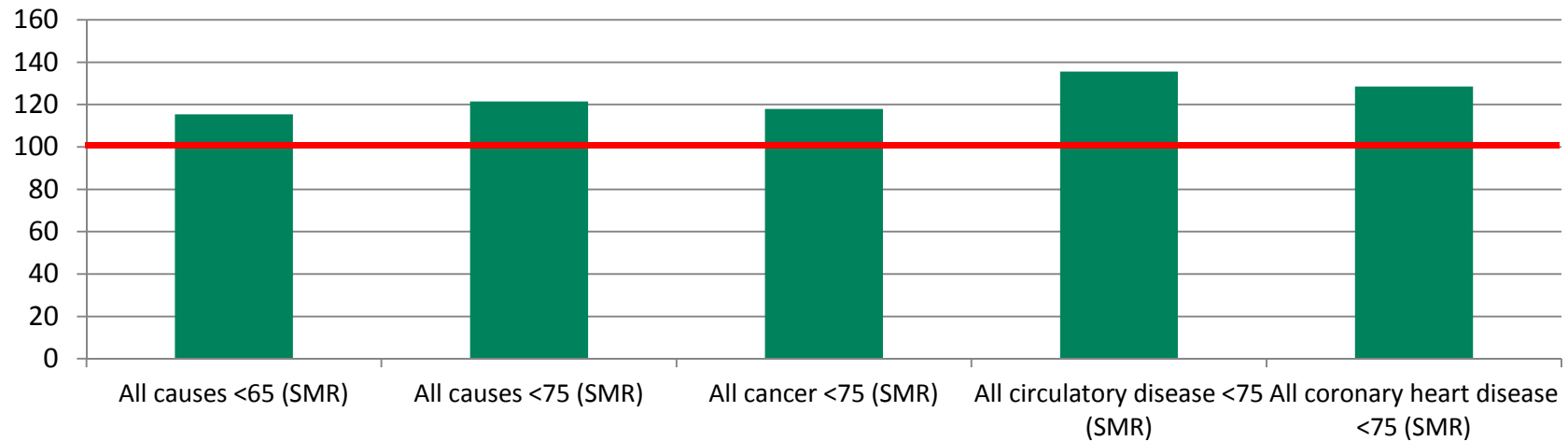
