

Camp Hill & Galley Common

Camp Hill & Galley Common are characterised predominantly by a younger population, with 22.1% of the population below the age of 16 and only 4.7% of the local population over the age of 75. The population density of the locality is 20.9 persons per hectare, which is considerably higher than the county and national averages. The proportions of ethnic minorities in the local area are notably lower than the Warwickshire averages. The percentage of the population that are not of a White UK origin, 5.4%, is approximately half the percentage of the Warwickshire average.

The population of this locality is 15,554. This population reside in a total of 6,464 household spaces. 22.0% of these households are detached properties; 38.1% are semi-detached and 32.3% are terraced homes. The proportions of households which are semi-detached and terraced homes are higher than the county averages. 70.0% of these households are either owned outright or are mortgaged, which is similar to the Warwickshire figure. A higher proportion of the households are rented from the local authority, than the county average. The average number of bedrooms in the households in this locality, 2.7, is identical to the national average, but lower than the Warwickshire average, 2.9. Within the locality there is one care home, without nursing, which houses 46 residents.

There is a higher level of income deprivation in this locality than the county and national average, 16.4% of the local population are live in income deprivation, compared to the 10.2% across Warwickshire and 14.7% across the country. The percentage of children living in poverty is also considerably higher in this locality than in the whole of Warwickshire, 23.2% in the locality compared to 13.9% at the county level. The percentage of pupils achieving 5 or more A* - Cs in their GCSEs is also much lower, at 45.3%, than the 60.8% at the county figure. The rate of long term unemployment in the local area, 6.4 per 1000 working age population, is also higher than the county average.

Standardised ratios compare the actual rate with the expected rate, adjusting for age and sex. The standardised ratios have been calculated with the England value as the reference value, therefore it is inappropriate to directly compare the locality figures with the Warwickshire figures. The standardised admissions ratio (SAR) for all cause emergency admissions in the locality was lower than the national rate. The SARs suggest there were more emergency admissions for strokes, heart attacks and chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) in Camp Hill & Galley Common than expected. The standardised incidence ratio (SIR) for lung cancer suggests the incidence of lung cancer in this locality was around 50% higher than expected. The standardised mortality ratio (SMR) in this locality for all cancers is 199.7, which means the rate of mortality in the local area was twice the expected rate.

The most important factors identified by local residents in making an area a good place to live are typical of the Warwickshire-wide response. A higher ranking was given by local residents to 'The level of congestion', compared to the Warwickshire-wide response, highlighting it as something which most needed improving in the local area. The biggest problem in the locality was identified as 'Teenagers hanging around on the street'. More than half of the population, 52.6%, were worried about having their car stolen, which was higher than the 37.4% who were worried about the same issue across the county.

Overall, the residents of Camp Hill & Galley Common are slightly less satisfied with the local area, with 80% of residents reporting to be either very satisfied or fairly satisfied with the local area as a place to live, compared to the county average of 88.6%.
