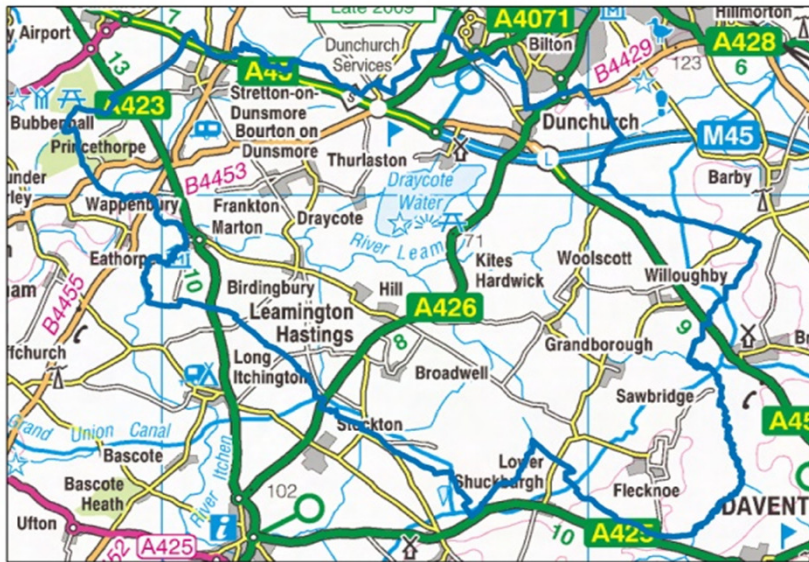


## Dunchurch Division



The locality of Dunchurch Division is approximately 43 square miles and comprises the wards of Leam Valley and Dunchurch and Knightlow and the electoral division of Dunchurch.

It lies to the south and west of Rugby Town and is a rural area, characterised by a network of agricultural land. A small area of the locality to the northwest is green belt. It borders Northamptonshire to the east, adjoining Daventry District.

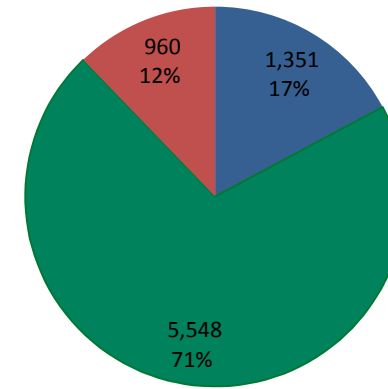

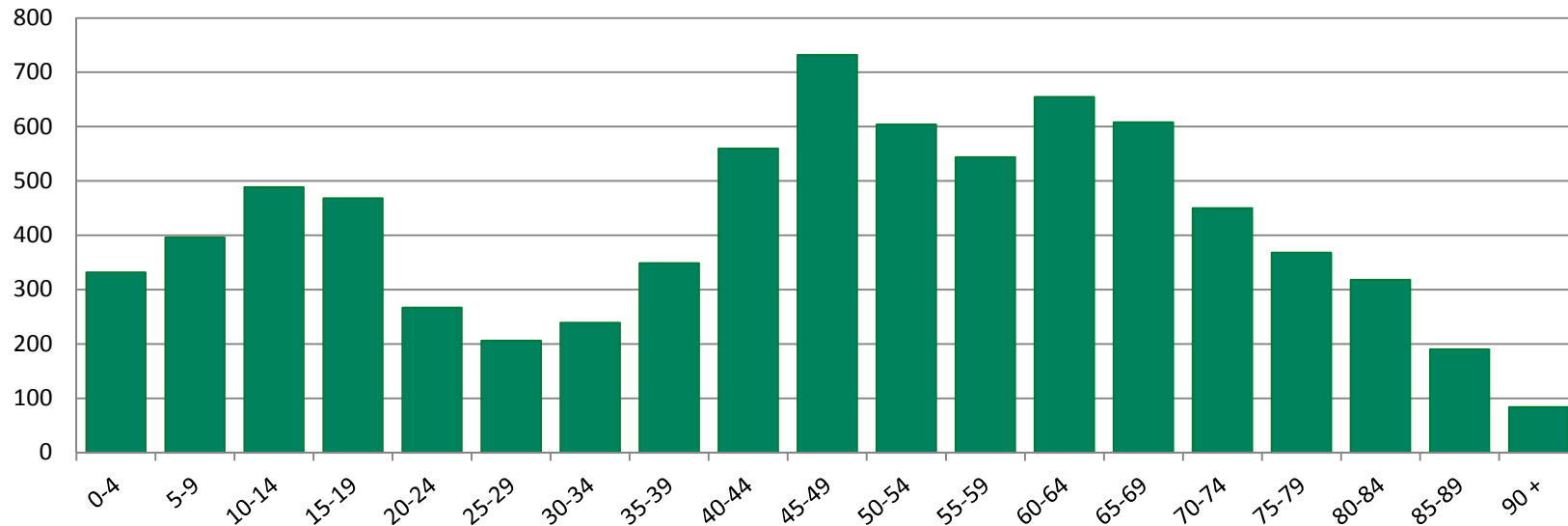

## Population By Five Year Age Groups

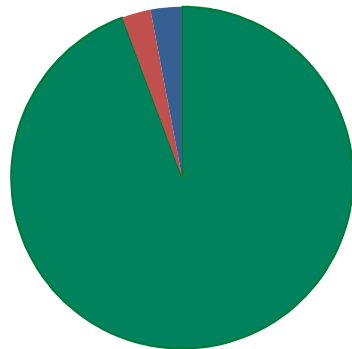

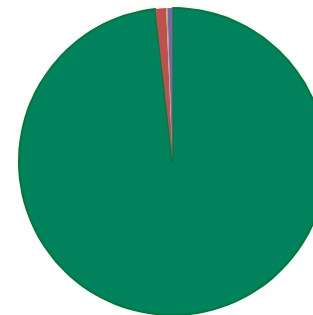

### Composition of Locality Population



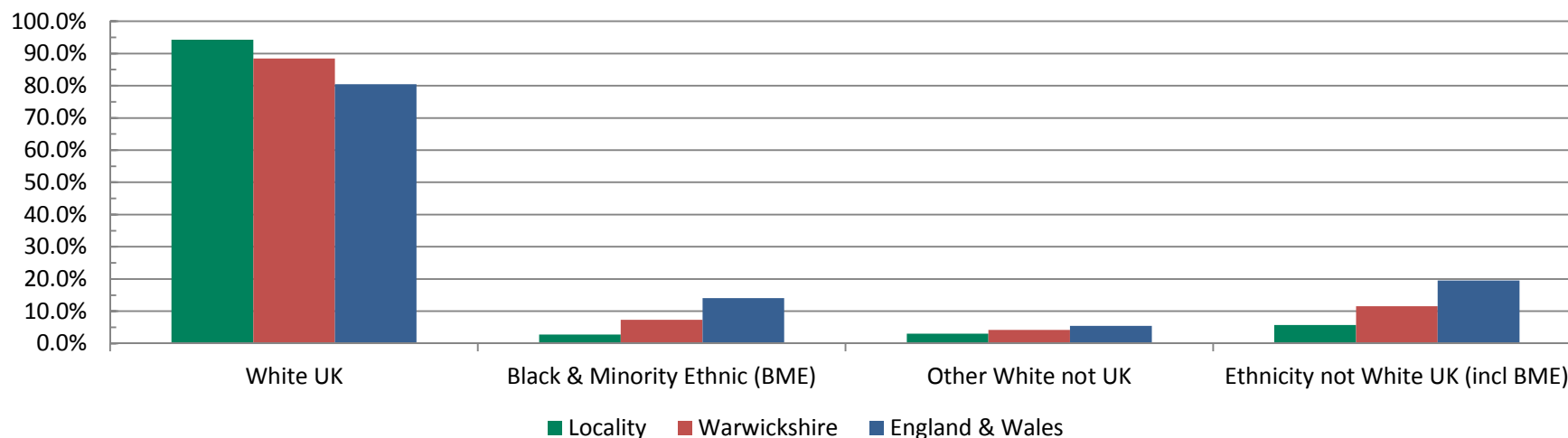

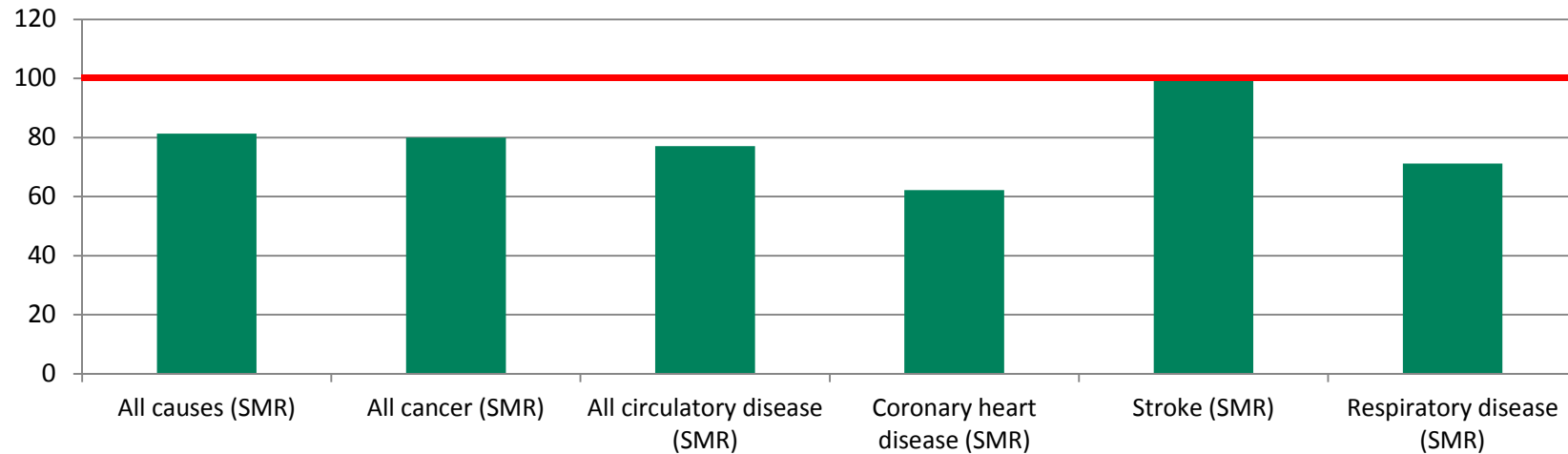

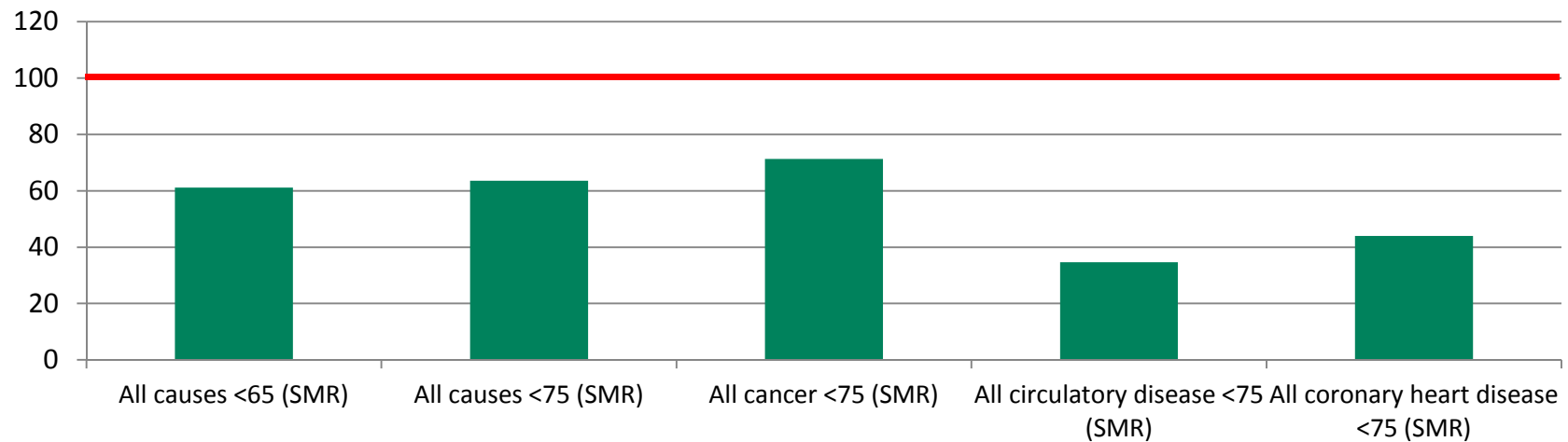
