

## Studley & Henley



The Studley and Henley locality comprises the wards of Tamworth, Sambourne, Studley, Henley, Claverdon and part of Snitterfield. It includes the County Council Electoral Divisions of Henley-in-Arden, Studley and part of Aston Cantlow.

The area is primarily rural with a mix of small towns, villages and hamlets. It borders Solihull to the north, Redditch in Worcestershire to the west and Stratford-on-Avon to the East.

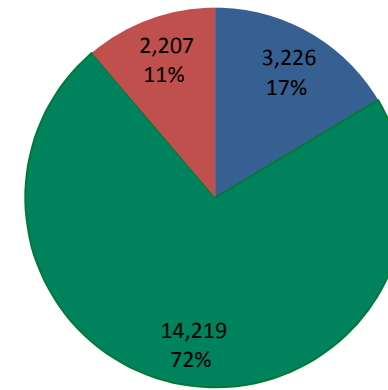

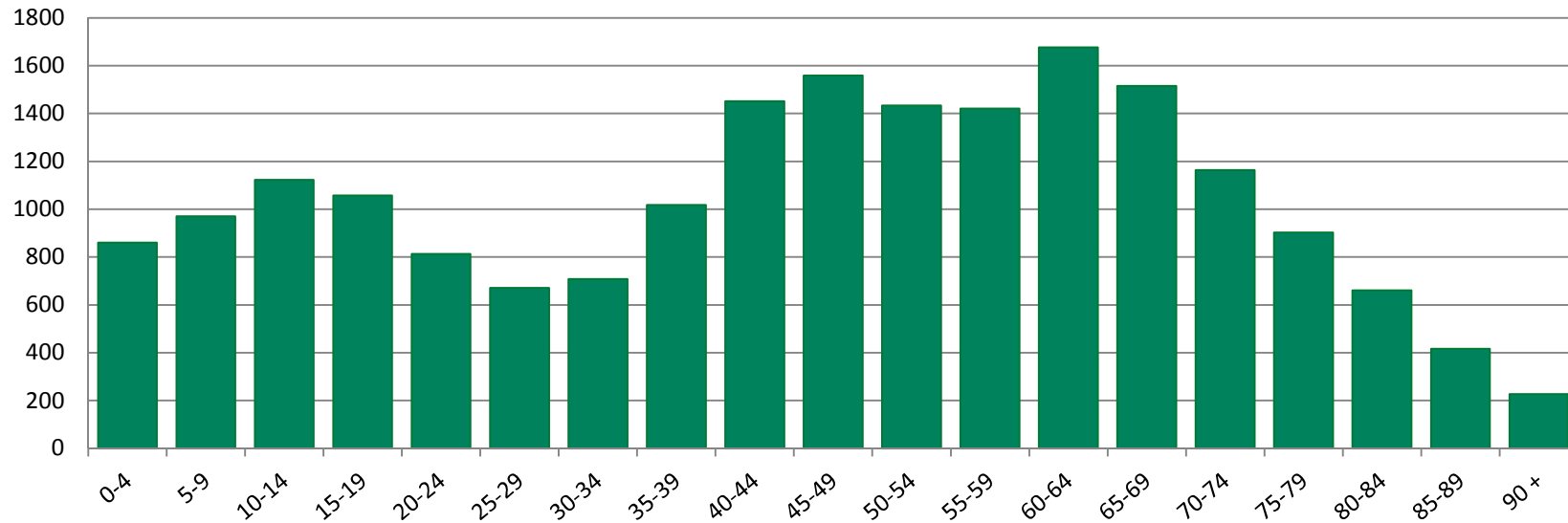

## Population By Five Year Age Groups

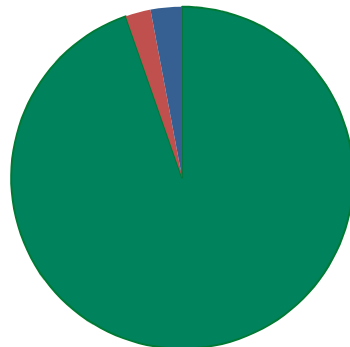

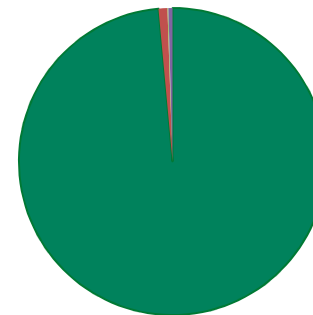

### Composition of Locality Population



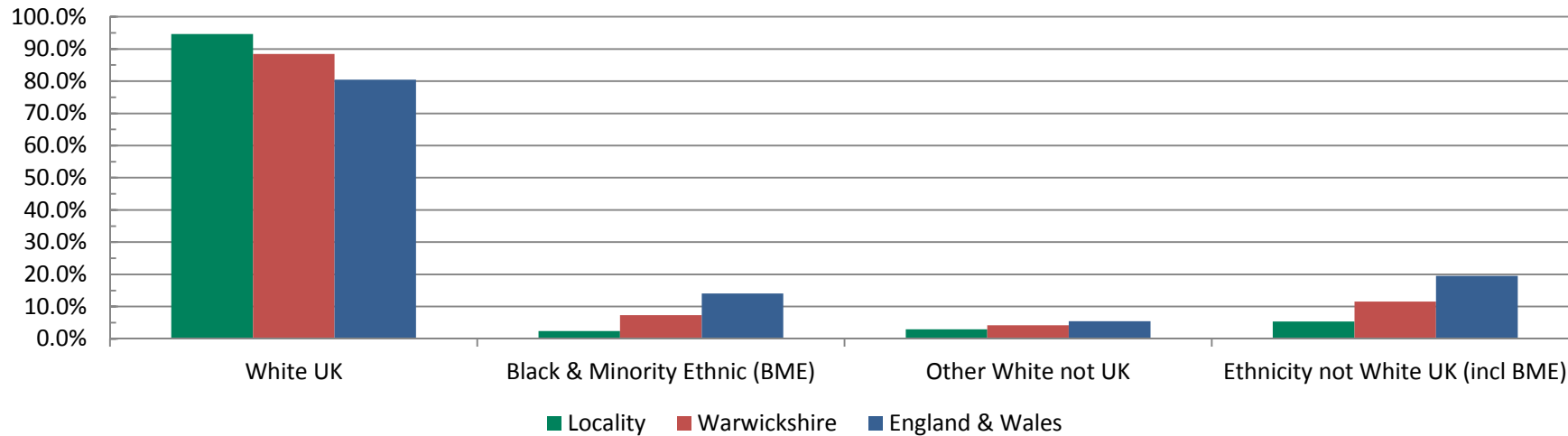

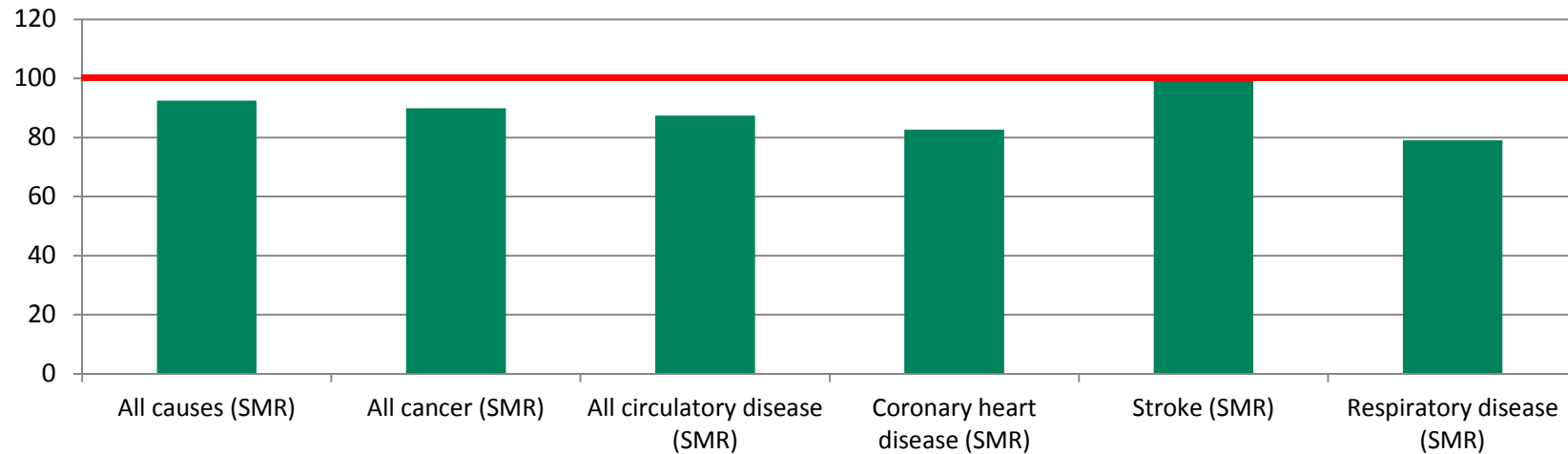

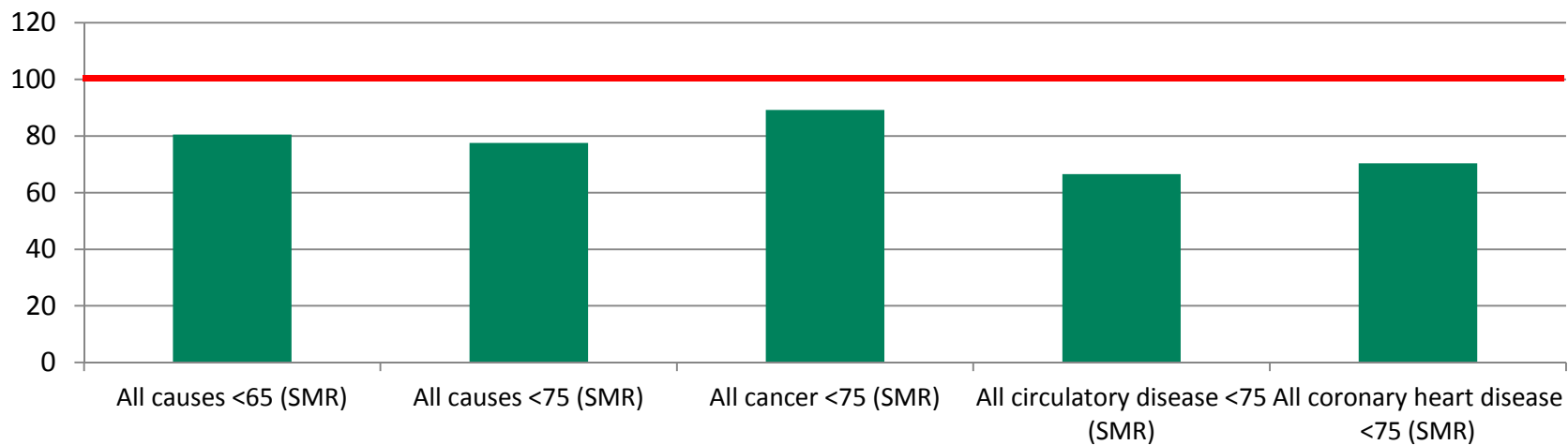
