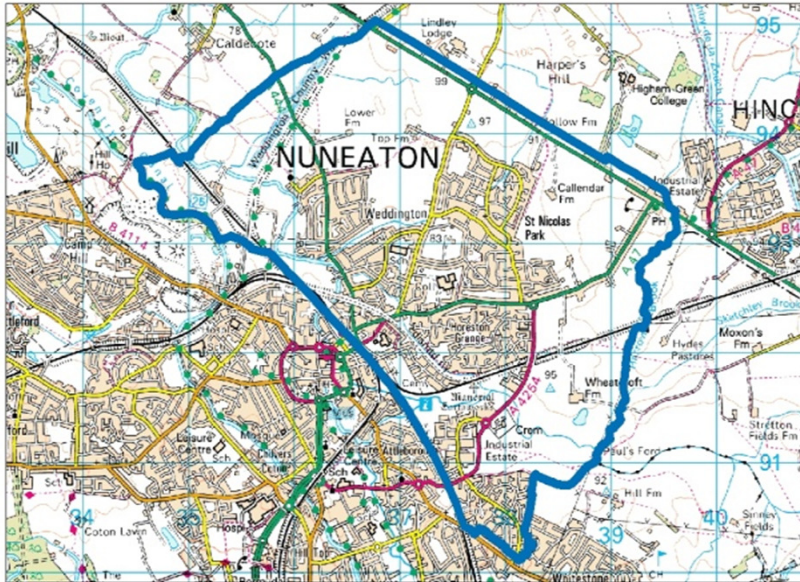


Weddington & St. Nicolas



The locality of Weddington and St. Nicolas comprises the wards of Weddington, St. Nicolas and the northern part of Whitestone. It also includes the County Council Electoral Divisions of Nuneaton Weddington and Nuneaton St. Nicolas.

The locality covers an area of approximately 5 square miles, from the eastern fringes of Nuneaton Town Centre to the Warwickshire - Leicestershire border near to the town of Hinckley. It encompasses the residential suburbs of Horeston Grange, Weddington and St. Nicolas Park

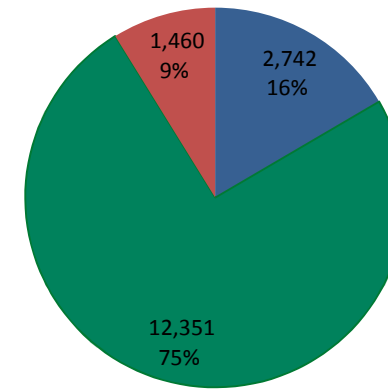

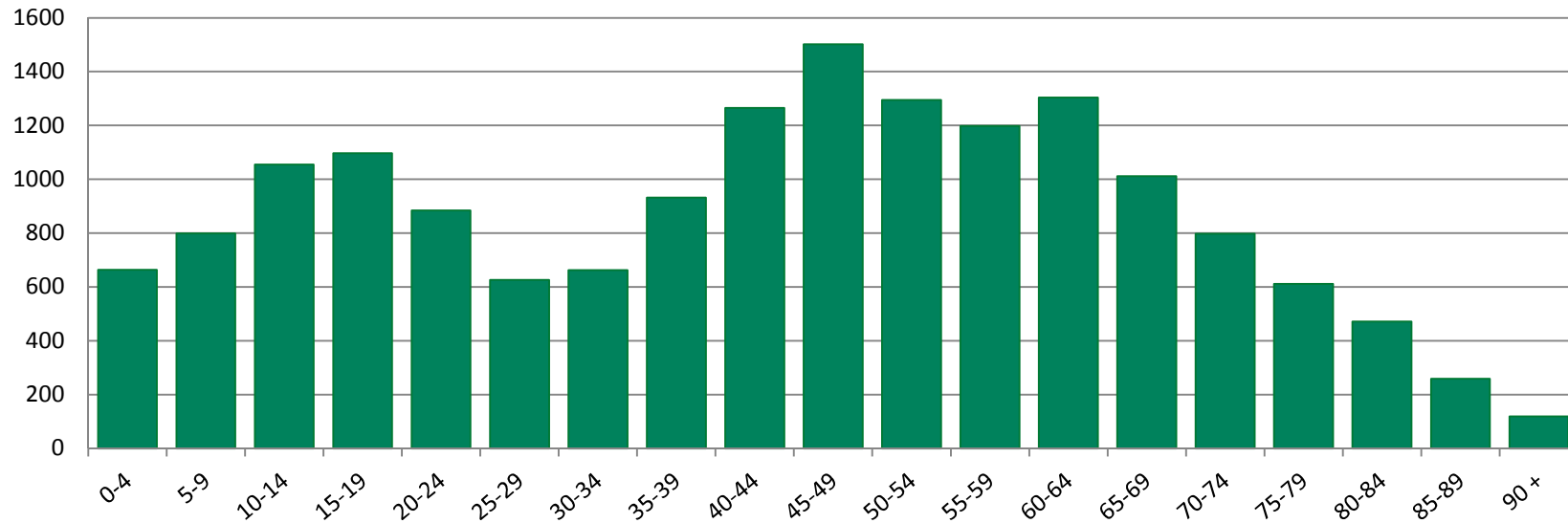

Population By Five Year Age Groups

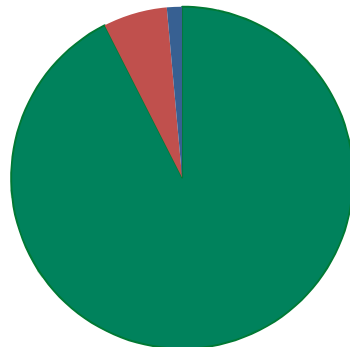

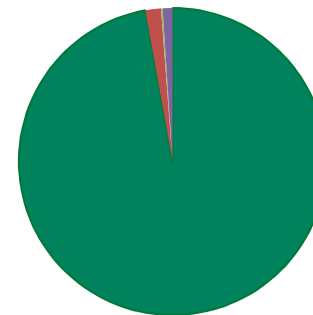

Composition of Locality Population



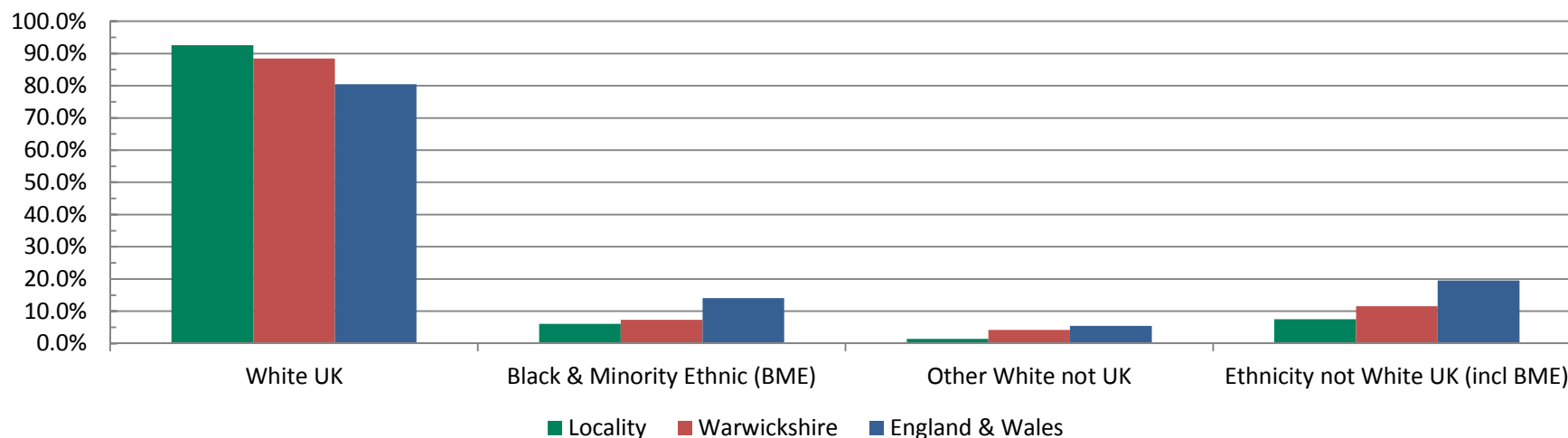

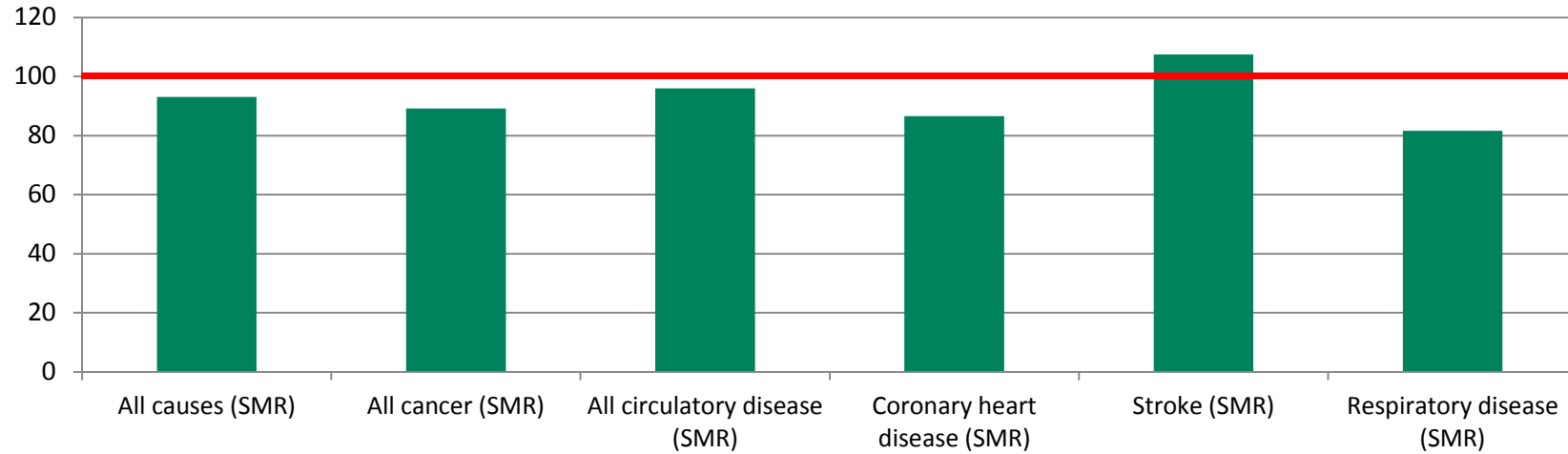

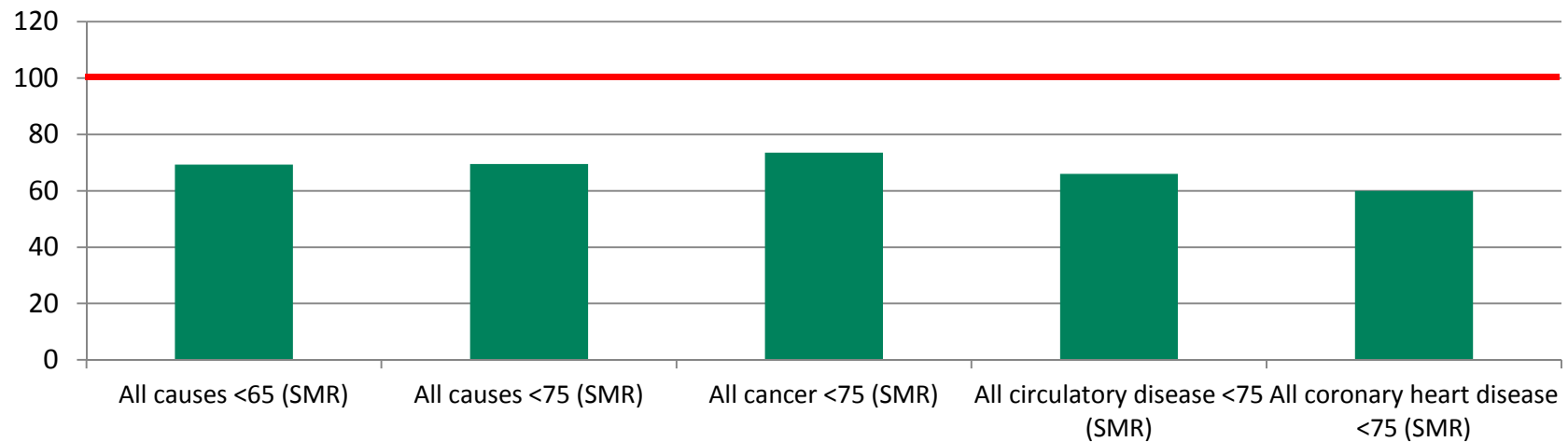
